

# SOC2880 Rome: History, Culture, and Society in the Eternal City | 4 credit hours

Rome. The very name conjures images of emperors and popes, gladiators and virtuoso artists. Yet for all its antiquity, Rome is a vibrant modern city, a European center for culture, religion, and politics.

This course will explore the history and present of the "eternal city." From antiquity to the modern world, we'll look at how Rome earned its reputation as the center of the world, the destination where all roads lead.

After studying the city's origin and growth, and its flourishing art scene of the renaissance, we'll explore Rome's historical legacy and thriving culture first-hand during an eight-day spring break trip.
