



These waivers and exceptions apply “only during any time in which the Governor has declared a disaster due to a public health emergency under Section 7 of the IEMA Act. If the Governor rescinds a disaster declaration, or allows it to expire without replacement,” these waivers and exceptions “shall remain in effect through the end of the calendar year (December 31) or the end of the fiscal year (June 30), whichever is later.” IAC 25.1010

“Notwithstanding any other requirements under this Part, a teaching candidate is not required to complete the teacher performance assessment required under Section 21B-30(f) of the Code and this Part.” IAC 25.1015

Content Test to begin student teaching

During a public health emergency, the content test is still a requirement; however, during the public health emergency, it is a requirement for *issuance of the PEL* rather than for entry to student teaching.

edTPA for Licensure

During a public health emergency, edTPA is waived as a requirement for licensure.

Disaster declaration lifted by governor or allowed to expire between	edTPA becomes effective with submission during student teaching in

July 1-December 31, 2021	Fall 2022
January 1-June 30, 2022	Spring 2023
July 1-December 31, 2022	Fall 2023
